



Alliumnet is a collaborative effort focused on supporting the production of allium species in the United States.

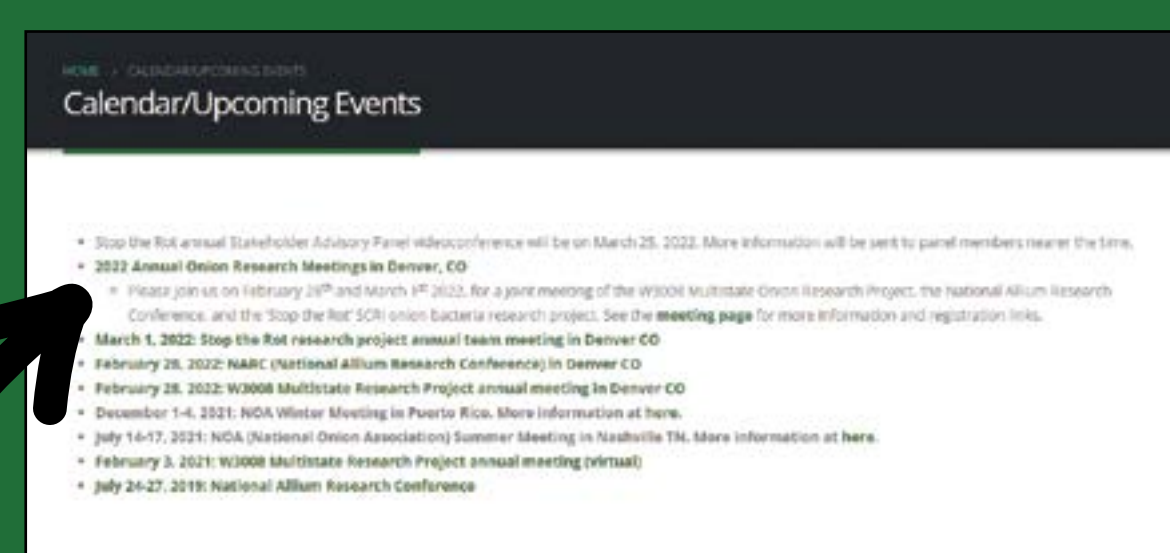
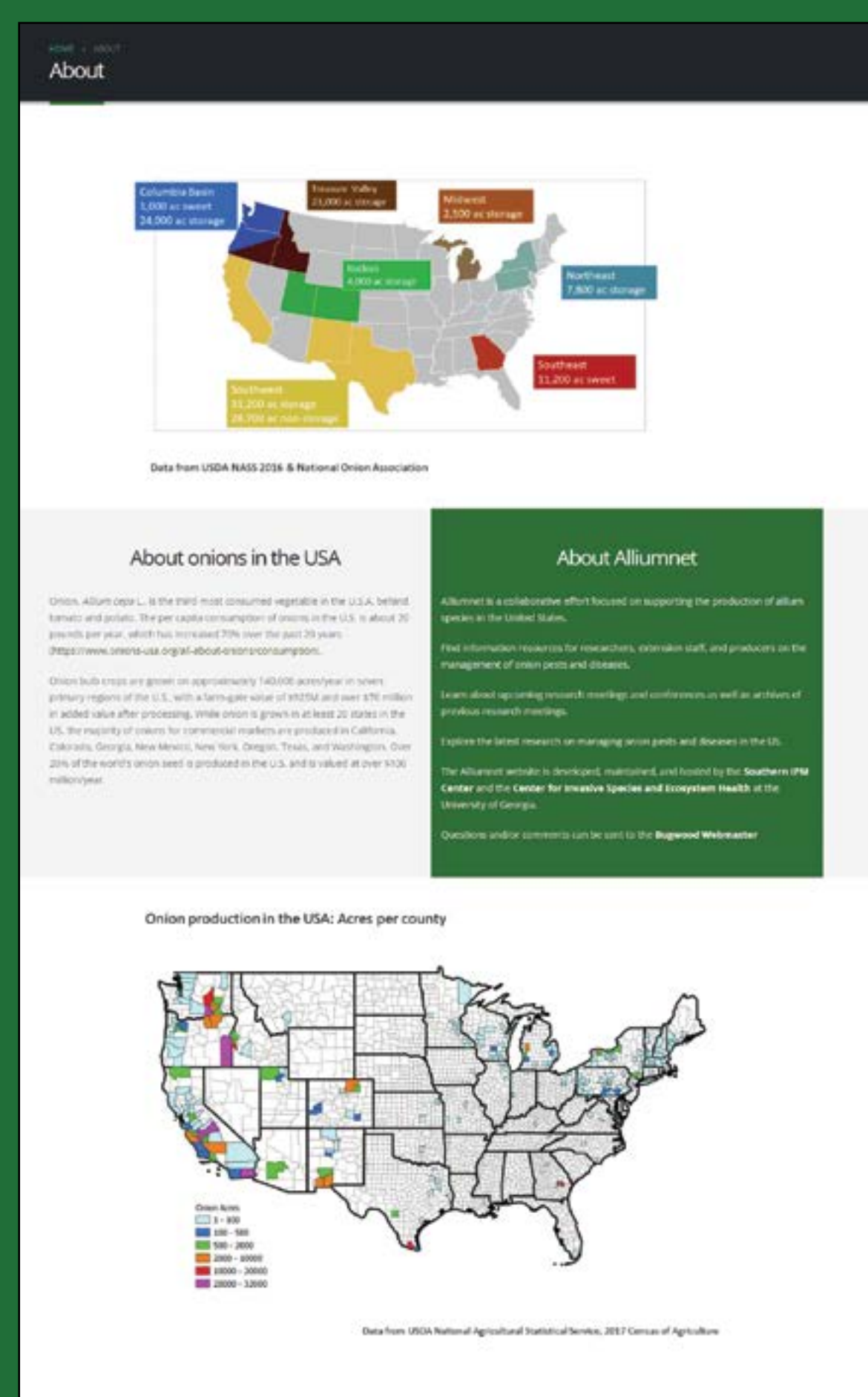
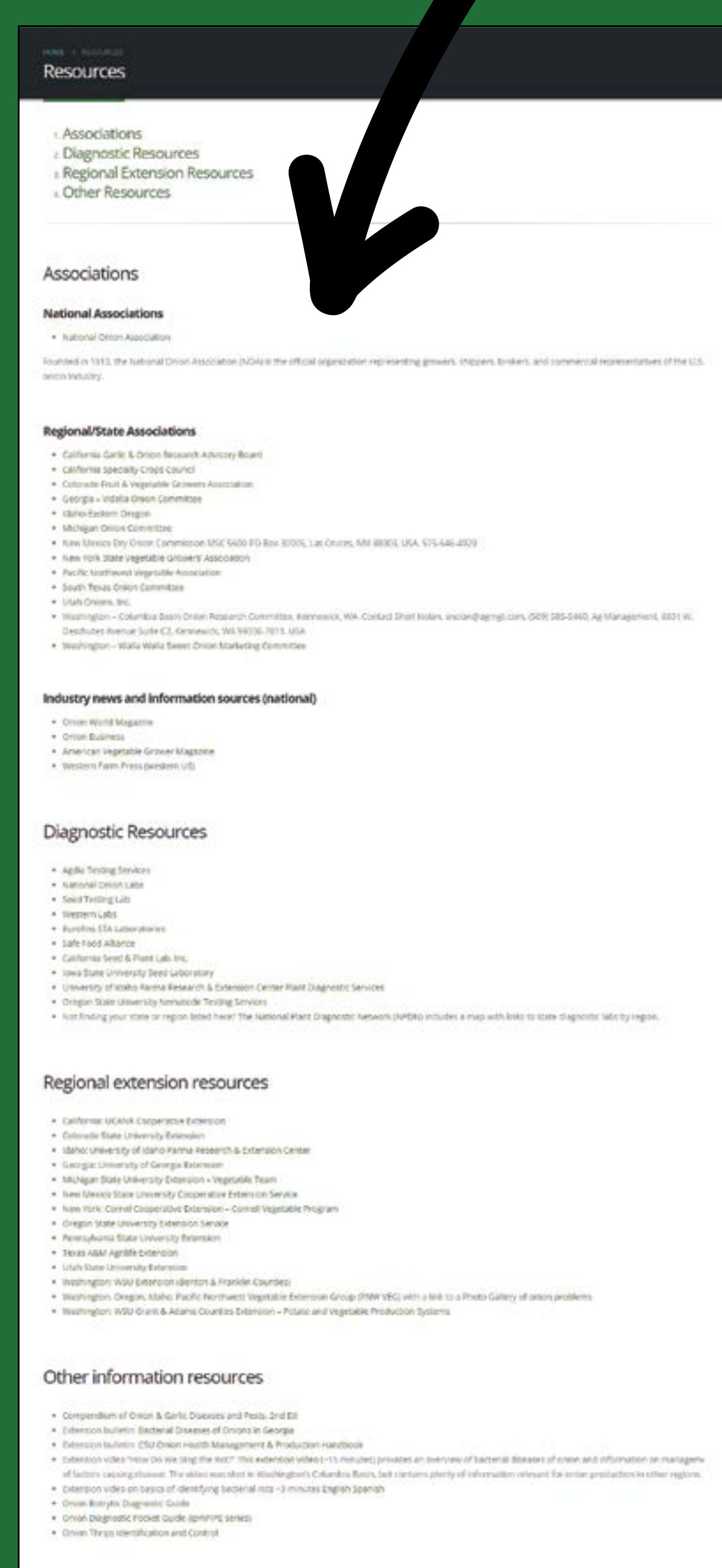

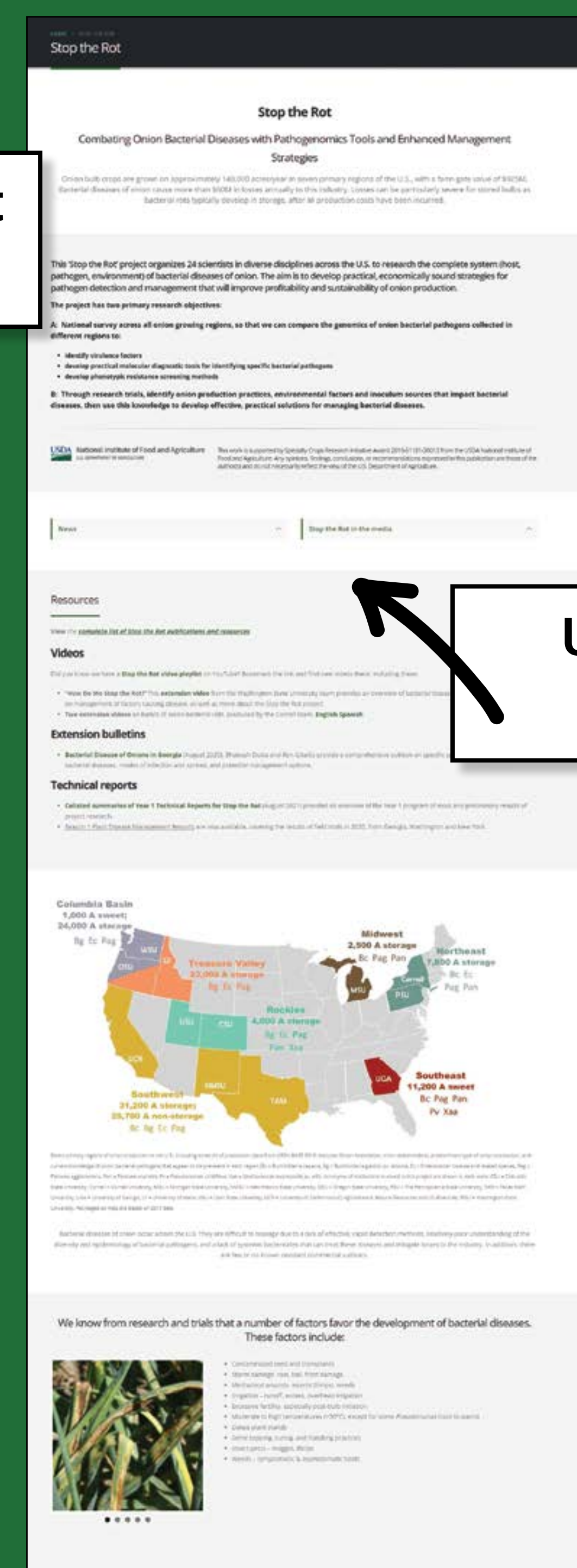

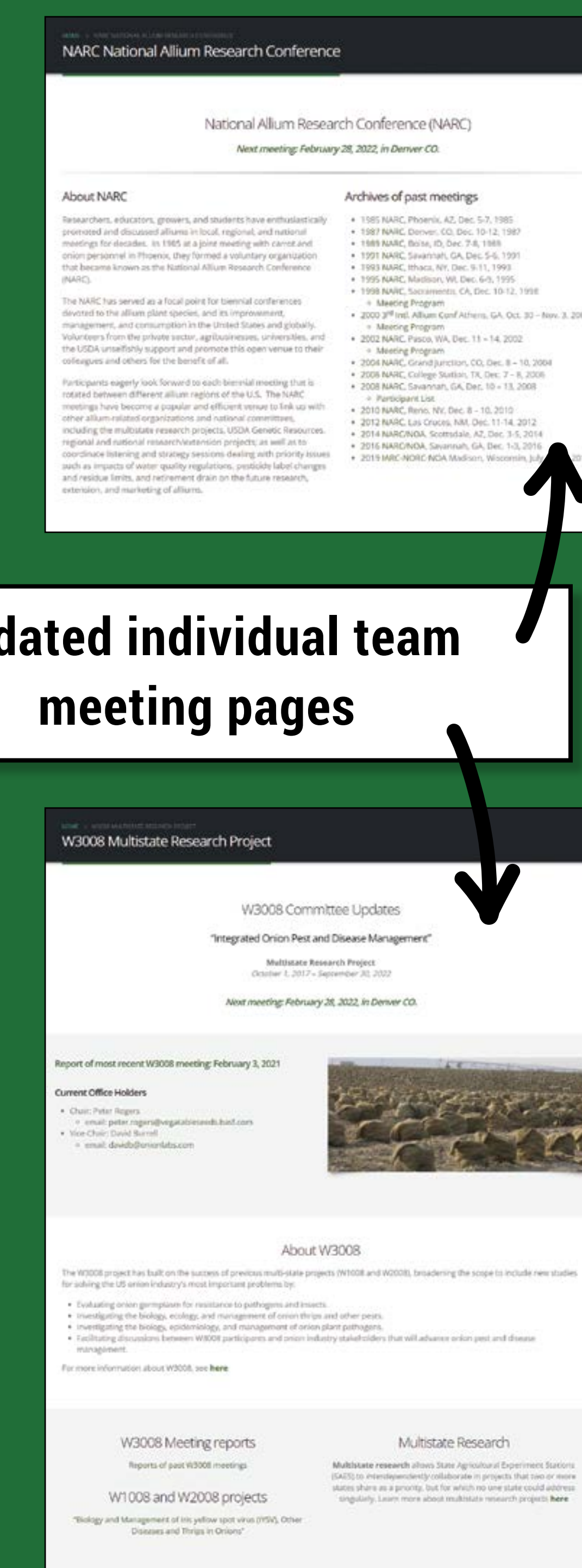
New layout and updated front page for easier navigation
